Security Plan Review

In light of the attack on transportation infrastructure in London, the Federal Maritime Security Coordinator (FMSC) for Northern California recommends that all vessels, companies and facilities review their security plans and procedures, remain vigilant and report any suspicious or unusual activities to the local Coast Guard or local law enforcement authorities by calling 911. Suspicious or unusual activities should be reported to the Coast Guard's 24-hour hotline at the National Response Center (NRC) at 1-800-424-8802 or e-mailed to lst-nrcinfo@comdt.uscg.mil.

The Maritime Security (MARSEC) level nationwide remains at MARSEC-1. The Coast Guard conducts an independent review of maritime infrastructure threats to determine the appropriate MARSEC level and that MARSEC level is not necessarily tied to the current Homeland Security Advisory System (HSAS) threat level. The Coast Guard currently has no indication of any threats to the San Francisco Bay area, the ports and waterways of Northern California, or to maritime interests in general.
