How: Feature animation films will be GBG's main drawing power and key source of revenue. Initially, fiscal sponsorship and outside funding will be critical to our early success, while endowment of time from friends and experts in the environmental, child, social, and animal welfare fields will help to ensure our ongoing success and longevity. It is essential we maintain close relationships with individuals and organizations that would like to see us succeed (and vice versa) if we are to flourish in our mission.

Progress: Over the past year working with passionate zeal our team has been building the first film of a trilogy. Please review GBG's updated project list below:

- **Operation Piggy Rescue Inc Moovie:** Feature animation film similar to Pixar's "Finding Nemo" from an artistic standpoint though packing more of an emotional punch while touching on the hog-dog rodeo debacle, piglet racing, boar hunting, veal calves, and the brutally corrupt factory farm industry. Moviegoers will fall in love with blind piglet "Pj" and her calf counterpart "Cj", two of the film's central stars.
- **Pj & Mr. Snappy Storybook:** tentatively set to release in July 2005. Children's book based on the movie
- **OPR Moovie Trailer:** 3-minute trailer to be aired at local theatres and submitted to Sundance Film Festival
- **The Rolly Moe Lima Bean Show:** Culinary comedy cook show to be aired on public television
- **Dream of Caves:** Feature animation film about 7 orphaned children from 7 war torn lands seeking refuge from the world of conflict in a beautiful and complex series of underground passageways and labyrinths

Crew: Rapidly expanding group of 18 dedicated artists working for gratis. Our professional and cultural backgrounds are exceptionally diverse with individual achievements in journalism, illustration, animation, psychology, law, taxation, social science, animal welfare etc. Some of the staff resides aboard as faraway as Hoeksche Waard, Holland and Oslo, Norway.

Founder: Byron Rourkacha was born in Berkeley at the tail end of the Vietnam War. He has traveled extensively abroad to write and experience life and poverty in diverse sectors of the world.
