

### **600-foot tanker runs aground in Alaska**

(CNN) -- A 600-foot, fully loaded tanker carrying 100,000 barrels of various types of oil and fuel broke free from a dock in Nikiski, Alaska, Thursday and ran aground, a U.S. Coast Guard official told CNN.

Darrell Wilson of the Coast Guard said it's not known yet if there is any leakage from the Seabulk Pride, which broke free from the dock at which it was loading around 5:30 a.m. (9:30 a.m. ET) in the Cook Inlet.

The double-hulled vessel is carrying 5,346 barrels of bunker (a kind of fuel oil), 94,951 barrels of vacuum tower bottom blend (a residual oil product), 2,392 barrels of diesel No. 2, and 1,135 barrels of gas wash, Wilson said.

The Seabulk Pride is owned by Seabulk Tankers Inc. of Fort Lauderdale, Fla. (Posted 1:25 p.m.)
